

To Access the Learning Express Library

Go to the Antigo Public Library website (www.antigopl.org) and move your mouse over "Reference and Research" on the top menu. Select "Databases" from the drop-down menu, then "LearningExpress Library." You will be able to access the database from the page which then appears.

On the LearningExpress home page, you will see a login space for returning and new users of the site:




At your first visit, click to register as a new user, and the following will appear:

Click the radial button next to Wisconsin Valley Library Services.

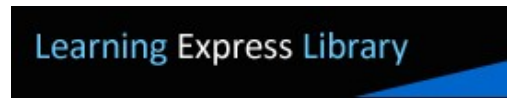
